## Healthy Boundaries for Clergy and Church Leaders

**Purpose:** These workshops are intended to equip ordained, commissioned, and licensed clergy, as well as other church leaders and staff, to understand healthy boundaries in ministry relationships. Healthy and vital ministries rely on trust and mutual support to create spaces of welcome and safety for all. Leaders must understand the role of power and vulnerability in order to create and maintain healthy boundaries and to choose healthy self-care strategies. These workshops are a joint endeavor of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Georgia and the Southeast Conference of the United Church of Christ, and fulfill requirements for such

a workshop every five years for DOC clergy and every three years for UCC clergy to retain ministerial standing. **Healthy Boundaries 101 – Fundamentals** is an introduction to healthy boundaries for clergy and church leaders. Topics include power, vulnerability, dating, friendships, dual relationships, transference, intimacy, hugging, and self-care. It is a prerequisite to Healthy Boundaries 201. **Healthy Boundaries 201 – Beyond Basics and into the Internet** is an advanced discussion of healthy boundaries for clergy and church leaders, designed for those who have completed Healthy Boundaries 101. Participants will cover boundaries, power, vulnerability, and self-care, as well as topics in internet technology and social media.

**“Healthy Boundaries 201: Beyond Basics and into the Internet”** to be held February 9 in Macon, GA and November 5 in metro Atlanta.

**Workshop fee is \$75**, which covers materials, lunch, snacks, and instructor travel and stipend. Registration fees must be received one week in advance of event, or a \$10 late fee will apply. No refunds will be issued, and no registrations will be taken at the door.

**Leadership:** **Rev. Marsha Brown** was among the first ordained through Pathways, a program of the United Church of Christ. She obtained her MA from Trevecca Nazarene University. She is the pastor of Phoenix Christian Church, UCC in Wildersville, TN, a member of the SECUCC Commission on Ministry, and has completed FaithTrust leadership training.

**The Rev. Erica Gerald**s is an ordained Disciples minister serving at Ray of Hope Christian Church, Decatur, GA. She also serves as a regional board member for the Christian Church in Georgia, licensed professional counselor, and hospice chaplain. Rev. Gerald earned both a Master of Divinity in Pastoral Care and Counseling and a Master of Science in Clinical Mental Health Counseling from Mercer University.

**Rev. David Kenley** is an ordained Disciples minister and a graduate of Lexington Theological Seminary. He had a 15-year ministry providing pastoral care in retirement and nursing facilities; followed by 10 years serving as guest minister in congregations in the United Kingdom. He currently is senior minister at Johns Creek Christian Church and has also completed FaithTrust leadership training.

**Minister Carrole Moss** is an ordained minister serving at Victory for the World Church in Stone Mountain, GA. She has actively served in the Southeast Conference United Church of Christ for the past 12 years, and currently serves as the Generosity Coordinator and chair of the Scholarship Committee. She has completed FaithTrust leadership training.

**Rev. Kathy McDowell** is an ordained Disciples minister and graduate of Candler School of Theology. She has taught Healthy Boundaries in Georgia since 2009 and has completed FaithTrust leadership training. She currently is the editor of *Just Women* Bible Study, published by Disciples Women. Prior to that, she served 10 years as a pastor and an associate pastor in two congregations in Georgia.
